

Pentatonic Stuff – www.playgtr.co.uk

I will not get too much into the pentatonic as you can find stuff all over the net. Too much has been said and done on the famous ‘pentatonic box’...As I say in the video, a major pentatonic is a major scale without the 4th and 7th degree. So C major pentatonic is:

C D E G A

These are the 5 positions for the major pentatonic, in the example in G major (but valid for all keys). Of course, remember that if you start from the 6th (the 5th note of the pentatonic - also ‘box’ N.5) you will have the relative minor. In the example in G the minor pentatonic will be E, just like E minor is the relative minor of a G major scale.
